

Download Educating Children With Multiple Disabilities A Collaborative Approach

The Arc Kohler School is a private school for students with developmental delays and disabilities. The school was founded in 1963 and is approved by the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE). Special education (also known as special-needs education, aided education, exceptional education, special ed. or SPED) is the practice of educating students in a way that addresses their individual differences and needs. Ideally, this process involves the individually planned and systematically monitored arrangement of teaching procedures, adapted equipment and materials, and accessible settings. According to *Diplomas Count: An Essential Guide to Graduation Policy and Rates* (Olson, 2006), the national graduation rate is 69.6 percent. This report estimates that in 2006 more than 1.2 million students—most of them members of minority groups—will not graduate from high school in four years with a regular diploma. Over the years, the researchers of the Temple University Collaborative have drawn upon their community inclusion study findings both to publish research papers in a wide array of professional, peer-reviewed publications and to share research findings in conference and workshop settings – many of which are listed here.
